
YOUNG PEOPLE ARE KEY TO ACHIEVING SDG #15




Wildfires are another cause of deforestation. We should make small fire-registering machines that, by moving to and sitting on the fire, extinguish it and send signals to fire stations.




Oxygen can't get in.

Batteries and cars use non-renewable resources. This causes global warming. Solar-wind batteries will solve this. These batteries would look like small tubes.






By rotating this lever, we produce mechanical energy, which is transformed into electrical, and allows us to send signals to the balls.




If you clicked **F RONT**, the ball moves to the front of the "balloon".




The top ball is heavier than the bottom and the small ball is on the front side of the "balloon" so the lever rotates in that direction.




At this moment, the smaller ball is on top. The bigger ball sends the liquid to the smaller ball on top, by contraction, and the cycle goes around again.



If we wanted to go backwards the smaller ball would go to the back of the, "balloon". By the rotation of this lever the wheels turn and we get movement.



Energy-shoes are another practical way of saving energy. They would have springs on the bottom and by walking they would contract and produce mechanic energy which would be transformed into electricity we would use for charging phones for example.



Wild landfills filled with plastic are everywhere and nobody cleans them because they don't see any value in it. Young people do! We could make special beads-making machines that every school would have. Kids and teachers would gather somewhere polluted. Making better biodiversity conservation decisions

When I spread my wings they are twice the size of an adult's arm span. My beak is sharp and long, and I use it skillfully to rip the flash off the carcasses I feed on. I am an attractive bird appealing to the eye with dark feathers on my wing ends and brownish ones on my back and wings, and white feathers on my neck. They call me the Griffon Vulture.

As a bird, I love the freedom of movement and seemingly vast lands, so I live in the open space next to gorges with poor vegetation in mountainous and Mediterranean areas. My Griffon fellows have long inhabited the Iberian and Balkan Peninsulas, parts of North Africa, the Caucasus and South-west Asia.

Griffons mature quickly, so the younglings move towards other territories and the parents stay in the place where they first laid their nest and had their nestlings. I was born in Serbia, where I have many cousins and friends that live in the canyons of the Uvac and the Milesevka rivers. It is exactly at the Uvac that the greatest nestling colony in the Balkans is located.

Our females lay only one egg. Both parents nest on the egg for about 50 days. The nestlings take three months to grow up, gain strength and become fit to fly. They remain near the nest for another month where they feel safe. We silently thank our parents for that and fly away into the wilderness until we reach reproductive maturity.

As all members of my species, once I am hungry, I feed on the carcasses of dead mammals, most commonly ungulates, or sometimes hares or foxes. I seldom attack living pray, only if it is a sick and dying animal. I find soft tissue, muscles and gut the most delicious.

Searching for food, I normally join a larger Griffon group, as it is then easier for us to spot the prey and cover larger areas than most birds. We regularly search areas within 50-60 km from our nests. It is sometimes hard to find food. That is why we are grateful when humans feed us since we are an endangered and protected species.

As a young Griffon, I wish to ask you, young people, to help us survive. As an animal species with a very scarce population and a low reproductive potential, we need to be provided with the basic survival conditions.

Thus overlook our nests, as it makes monitoring our population in particular areas easier. *Monitoring* is essential for the protection of our species.

Whenever possible, volunteer and help the employees of the national parks where we live by providing food on the feeding grounds in our vicinity. *Feeding* is important for our well-being. A constant food supply makes us fit in hard times and mating seasons. *Building feeding* grounds reduces the chances of our poisoning by poisonous baits that are, unfortunately, still in wide use. Constant food flow also helps reproductively immature younglings stay in the colony, which attracts single birds, thus increasing the chances of its growth.

Please, help ornithologists ring us as we do not mind that; on the contrary, it helps monitor our movement and participate in projects of the protection of our species and the environment.

Dear young people, your help with these measures will certainly help the stabilization and enlargement of our population in our reservations. Please, participate in projects of our reintroduction to the areas where we used to live as much as you can. We are an important part of the food chain. Our potential extinction would be harmful for all.

Enjoy watching us fly freely, enjoy the beauty of our feathers and elegance of our wings by helping us survive sharing the natural resources of our Mother Earth.

Life on land

For a long time people pollute the Planet. It's time to end it. If people cut all trees and destroy the forest ecosystems all around the world, it will destroy all the living world and us in the end. So we must save the world before it is too late.

A lot of people think about this, but only some of them are ready to take part.

Only 29% of the Earth surface area is arable land. Forests occupy 30%, of this area, from the equator to the cold regions as Siberia. Before they began to cut down trees for the development of cities, the forests occupied about 60% of the planet. Today, more than 2 billion people use wood for heating and cooking.

Trees are the main source of oxygen for respiration. They are lungs of our planet. One pine or oak tree has a total surface of leaves that can cover about 80 acres of land with oxygen. Each tree from rainforests has total surface of leaves that can cover about 16 acres. Over a large leaf surface trees literally take carbon dioxide after we consume it as biological waste, and produce oxygen as its biological byproduct. Without trees our atmosphere would become poisonous to all life.

My idea is that people should start growing trees in an artificial way. This could be done by taking plant cells and by artificial means we would cultivate them much faster than in natural conditions.

In this way, we will prevent the forests overcutting, leaving enough space to meet the needs of human society. The factories would work on bio-renewable energy so we could solve the planet's pollution and save the natural resources. The factories would be built close to big cities, the largest plant mass consumers. In this way we would reduce the consumption of natural wood that grows far from the cities.
